Articles of Association

Mission Statement:

Our mission is to present the good news of Jesus Christ and develop disciples of our Lord by building Christ-centred relationships using the equipping provided at the Christian Leaders College.

ARTICLE I

Section 1: Name

Our name is the **Christian Leaders Alliance of Kenya**., also known as CLAK.

Section 2: Purpose

The CLAK's primary focus is to provide a platform where various graduates of Christian Leaders College, in Kenya, can interact relationally at a practical level but also engage the public as Christian Leaders. This shall be done through local chapters dubbed "**County Alliance**" hence comprised of *Spiritual Mentors, the Mentors Club and Mentorship Hubs*. Hitherto, CLAK will be an overseer of the various county alliances geared towards having a united vision culminating in an annual conference.

The CLAK is organized as localised interactive ministries of the global Christian Leaders Ministries yet exclusively for charitable and educational purposes. All funds, whether income or principal, and whether acquired by gift or contributions or otherwise, shall be devoted to said purposes.

ARTICLE II

Section 1: Individual Members

Membership is open to individuals who have been ordained into the Christian Leaders Alliance after satisfying the course requirements. The least level of individual admission is the Deacon Minister.

Section 2: Mentoring Members

These are the individual members who have attained into proficiency, to be able to teach and provide spiritual counselling to other members. The basic course requirement that must be proved by individuals who want to be admitted into this category includes **LEADERSHIP, LIFE COACH MINISTER, MANAGEMENT BY THE BOOK** and **HOUSE CHURCH MINISTER**

Section 3: Mentorship Club

This shall be leadership association at a local level, consisted of Mentor Members who also shall provide the required local leadership at their corresponding county zones dubbed as "*Christian Leaders County Alliance*".

Section 4: Mentorship Hub

This shall be a collective association of individual members, mentoring members and local Christian Leaders College students who are not yet members of the Christian Leaders County Alliance but are actively enrolled and taking a course that is verifiable in their transcript.

ARTICLE III: Coaches and Coordinators

The following positions are at volunteer level and must be accepted by the Advisory Board.

Section 1: County Coaches

These shall be individual members of the **Christian Leaders Alliance of Kenya** active in their respective counties as “**Mentoring Member**” but will have established a **HOUSE CHURCH** hence a minister. Additionally, the established HOUSE CHURCH will have been recognised and verified as existing by the Advisory Committee making the individual a qualified “*County Coach*”. Only **Mentoring Members** can become “*County Coaches*”.

Section 2: Regional Coaches

These shall be individual members of the Christian Leaders Alliance of Kenya active in their respective counties as “County Alliance Leaders”. Several counties might join together to define a region and when accepted by the Advisory Board, such a region will be managed by a “**Regional Coach**” who must also be a **Life Coach** having attained a minimum grade of “**B**” at the certification average exam as offered by Christian Leaders College.

Section 3: Regional Coordinators

Each established local region of the Christian Leaders Alliance of Kenya must elect a coordinator who will attend the national leadership meetings as organised by the National Leader.

ARTICLE IV Advisory Board

Section 1: Powers

An Advisory Board, who shall exercise or direct the exercise of all administrative powers of said By-Laws, shall manage the business and affairs of the CLAK.

Section 2: Number

- Selected Advisory Board Members; **Five individuals** will serve on the Board. Chief Mentor (*President*), Chief Coordinator and the Regional Coaches.

Section 3: Duties

The management of the business affairs of the Christian Leaders Alliance of Kenya is the sole responsibility of the Advisory Board. The Advisory Board, in addition to the duties and powers prescribed elsewhere in these By-Laws, shall have power and it shall be its duty:

- i. To establish local administrative committees.
- ii. To prepare or cause to prepare and review the annual budget of the Christian Leaders Alliance of Kenya
- iii. To call regular and special meetings of the alliance.
- iv. To amend the By-Laws of this alliance as a ministry.

ARTICLE V: The FOUNDING Office

The Christian Leaders Kenya Alliance has been founded by **Adhengo Boaz Ministries**, offering patronage to nurture the organisation towards a multi-ministry relation of the many who are continuously joining the Christian Leaders College, but importantly, as a national association of stewards with a priority of making disciples. It is the Kenyan component of the continental body that has also been founded within the vision of Chaplain Boaz Adhengo, HSC.

Through the **Missions Mobility Fund**, the **Christian Leaders Africa Alliance** is actively growing, with similar organisations as CLAK being founded within the countries that have united into a continental alliance.
